
- Implementation of the policy in letter and spirit through proper reporting of the complaints and their follow-up procedures.

SYNOPSIS:

Sexual harassment is an extremely distressing issue that degrades the quality of an organisation, makes it unsafe, reduces a friendly environment and outrightly disrespects the fundamental rights of an individual. In order to curb and prevent the issue of sexual harassment, the Government enacted the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.

The 2013 Act defines sexual harassment as one or more unwelcome acts or behaviour (either directly or indirectly) such as:

- 1. Physical contact and advances; or
- 2. A demand or request for sexual favours; or
- 3. Making sexually coloured remarks; or
- 4. Showing pornography
- 5. Any other unwelcome physical, verbal, or non-verbal conduct of a sexual nature.

The entire program was based on the above points and also enlightened the students to claim their rights and duties.


