Report on AIDS Awareness Program

In observance of **World AIDS Day**, the Department of Zoology, St. Joseph's Degree College, organized an **AIDS Awareness Program** at **Mamidalapadu Village, Kurnool**, on December 1, 2023. The program aimed to educate the community about HIV/AIDS, its prevention, and the need to eliminate social stigma associated with the disease.

Objectives of the Program:
